TRU CO-OP STUDENT OF THE YEAR AWARD SELECTION CRITERA RUBRIC

The TRU Co-op Student of the Year Awards Committee evaluates candidates on their impact to the three main stakeholders of Co-operative Education. Each criterion carries 1/3 of the overall score, out of 90. Subsequent review within the committee of the merits of top candidates (based on initial scores) helps to determine the winner(s).

- 1. (30 pts) impact on student (self)
- 2. (30 pts) impact on institution
- 3. (30 pts) impact on organization/employer
